

Career Guidance

Individualized Career Assistance is available to help you decide on a major and understand opportunities within your specific field. We also offer the following online resources:

- Focus 2: Web-based tool to help you understand how your values, interests, and skills relate to various careers; suggests career pathways and provides career information on several hundred occupations. Individualized interpretation is offered as follow-up.
- Myers-Briggs Type Indicator (MBTI): Widely used in determining how personal preferences fit in with lifestyle, work environment, and various occupations.
- Strong Interest Inventory (SII): Assesses interests and compares your individual profile with successful individuals in hundreds of professional occupations; useful in guiding your selection of an academic major as well as a career path.

Career-Related Assistance

- Columns CareerLink: Search for Job and Internship openings 24/7 and register for career-related events.
 Explore on-line databases with hundreds of local, national, and international listings.
- **Going Global:** Includes international job and internship openings and country specific employment information.
- Vault: Career Insider by Vault is a web-based system that gives you career information and valuable insight into hundreds of occupations.
- Resume and Professional Correspondence: Develop your resume, write business correspondence, and compose graduate school essays.
- Athlete Network: Assists current athletes with making career connections for jobs, internships, and networking.
- Workshop Series: Seminars are offered throughout the school year on topics ranging from Resume Writing to Professional Etiquette.
- Mock Interviews: Practice a job, internship, or graduate school interview before the actual interview!
- Individual Appointments: Meet with a Licensed Professional Counselor (LPC) to discuss choosing a major, deciding on a career field, or other career related needs.

Centralized Internship Program
